# Terms and Conditions of Entry

## 1. About

The North West Hospital and Health Service (NWHHS), Child and Youth Mental Health Service (CYMHS) Art Competition is focused on promoting mental health service awareness and well-being.

CYMHS invites young people to design an original art piece to be used on the CYMHS work shirts and other promotional products.

The CYMHS Art Competition aims to:

- Raise awareness about mental health in youth and the Mental Health Services available to them.
- Encourage young people to identify, discuss and seek help for mental health problems and create a more accepting environment for young people to do so.
- To bring the community together and provide a platform to discuss and educate young people about the importance of mental well-being and reduce the stigma around mental health and, ultimately, lead to greater awareness and understanding of these vital issues.

## 2. Terms and Conditions

- Information on how to enter the Competition and prize details form part of the Terms and Conditions of entry (Terms). These terms apply to the Competition and entry into the Competition is acceptance and understanding of these terms.
- Nothing submitted for entry will be returned.
- Once an art piece is submitted, the entrant/s will not be able to edit or replace a submission.
- By entering this art competition, the entrant artist/s grants the North West Hospital and Health Service (NWHHS) a perpetual, non-exclusive licence to publish and reproduce images of the artwork for health promotions, campaigns and materials on all kinds of media and in any format.
- The Competition will be open from 30 March 2026 and will close at close of business (04:30pm) (Eastern Standard Time) 26 June 2026.
- The winners will be announced during Mental Health Week celebrations 2026 and on the North West Hospital and Health Service (NWHHS) Facebook page and website.
- All submissions must be original – applicants cannot use third-party artwork or materials in their work – this means that they cannot use anything that was created by someone else (especially if it is trademarked or restricted by the original artist).
- Competition entrants are responsible for checking the authenticity, copyright and permissions for each art piece. Competition organisers, North West Hospital and Health Service (NWHHS) or Queensland Health will not be held liable for any issues relating to these matters. By entering the competition, entrants accept their own liability relating to these matters.
- Entrants release and hold harmless the North West Hospital and Health Service (NWHHS), their officers, directors, staff, from any claims including law fees relating to any damage.

## 3. Who Can Enter

The CYMHS Art Competition is open to school students in the following age categories:

- **School Years 4–6**
- **School Years 7–9**
- **School Years 10–12**

The competition is open to students attending schools located in areas serviced by the North West Hospital and Health Service, including Burketown, Camooweal, Cloncurry, Dajarra, Doomadgee, Julia Creek, Karumba, McKinlay, Mornington Island, Mount Isa and Normanton, as well as students enrolled in School of the Air.

Students may enter as an individual, group, or class. Entries submitted on behalf of a group must nominate one contact person who has at least one valid email address for communication purposes.

There is no limit on the number of entries an eligible participant may submit; however, repeated or duplicate entries will not be accepted.

## 4. Artwork Brief

Create an original artwork A4 or A3 in size and in any colour that encompasses the following theme: **Inside My World - thoughts, feelings, culture and country.**

Your piece may take any visual form or creative expression, including:

- Digital art.
- Colour palette.
- Art medium (e.g., acrylic or water colour paint, pencil, pen, and/or crayon).

The NWHHS reserves the right, at its sole discretion, to reject work that is not found suitable for publication or that does not meet its criteria. Art that depicts graphic racial or sexual violence is not acceptable.

Art pieces submitted must not:

- Be sexually explicit or suggestive, unnecessarily violent or derogatory of any ethnic, racial, gender, religious, professional or age group, profane or pornographic, contain nudity or any dangerous activity, firearms/weapons (or the use of any of the foregoing), any activities that may appear unsafe or dangerous, or any political agenda or message.
- Be obscene or offensive, endorse any form of hate or hate group.
- Defame, misrepresent, or contain disparaging remarks about the North West Hospital or Health Service or its services.
- Infringe the intellectual property rights of any third party and must not contain trademarks, logos or trade dress owned by others, or advertise or promote any brand or product of any kind.
- Contain any personal identification, such as vehicle number plates, personal names, email addresses or street addresses.
- Contain copyrighted materials owned by others (including photographs, sculptures, paintings and other works of art or images published on or in websites, television, movies or other media).
- Include images of corporate logos, trademarks, identities, or other proprietary materials owned by others such as television shows, magazines, or web pages.
- Communicate messages or images inconsistent with the positive images and/or goodwill to which the North West Hospital and Health Service wishes to associate; and must not depict, and cannot itself be in, violation of any law, Intellectual Property, Moral Rights and Privacy.

## 5. How to Enter

To enter the Competition and to be eligible to win one of the prizes, eligible entrants must complete an entry application form, which includes:

- **Entrant's full name or team name.**
- **Valid contact phone number.**
- **Name of the school the entrant/s attends.**
- **A description of the art piece in 200 words or less.**
- **Create an original art piece that meets the criteria as set section 4.**

Submit the art piece by the competition close date and time as set out in section 2, either:

## 6. Judging

The winning entries will be determined by a panel of judges from across the North West Hospital and Health Service and North West QLD Community. The winning art piece will be determined based on the following:

- **Audience Engagement** - Does your piece evoke thought, feeling, discussion or action?
- **Creativity and Originality** - Does your piece convey an interesting and new approach to the theme concepts?
- **Clarity of Theme** - Is your interpretation of the theme clear?
- **Composition** - Do all your elements work together to produce an overall effect?

## 7. Prizes

Prizes will be awarded to the winner in each of the three School Year categories. If the winners are not in attendance when the winning pieces are announced, they will be contacted via phone or email and arrangements will be made for prizes to be collected. The winners' names and copies of the winning pieces will be published on the North West Hospital and Health Service Facebook page and website.

## 8. Copy Right

By entering the competition, each eligible entrant:

- Warrants that the entry is an original work, meaning that it has been created by the eligible entrant, has not been copied from any other source, and does not incorporate any material or idea from any other person.
- Grants to the North West Hospital and Health Service (NWHHS) an irrevocable, perpetual, royalty-free, worldwide non-exclusive licence, to display, publish, communicate to the public, broadcast for the purpose of marketing and promoting the NWHHS, in any media (including media not yet in existence), including, but not limited to:
  - online websites
  - social media sites
  - conferences
  - publications published and distributed by the NWHHS relating to this competition.
- In consideration of the publicity and exposure they receive from their work being exhibited in the CYMHS Art Competition, each finalist grants to the NWHHS, partners and sponsors a non-exclusive, perpetual, irrevocable, worldwide and royalty-free licence to use their art piece entered for the advertising and promotion of the Competition in any form of media now known or yet to be devised, both from the date the finalists are announced and in future years. Entrants acknowledge and agree that the NWHHS, partners and sponsors are not liable to pay the finalist artists any fee, royalty or other form of remuneration for this right.
- By entering the competition, the eligible entrant/s and their parent/guardian (if applicable) agrees and acknowledges that:
  - they may be contacted by the NWHHS to provide comments about the competition and may take photos of them. The NWHHS may use such comments or photos
  - (Materials) for the NWHHS's future promotional and marketing purposes without further reference or compensation to them
  - the NWHHS may duplicate, alter, adapt and utilise these Materials as they wish at anytime, anywhere, and by any means. they acknowledge that, by entering the competition, they grant to the NWHHS on creation of these Materials a royalty-free, perpetual, exclusive and irrevocable licence to use the Materials for whatever purpose, they unconditionally and irrevocably consent to any act or omission that would otherwise infringe any of their moral rights in these Materials,
